

Your = when something belongs to you

You're = when you want to shorten you are

TOP TIP: Check if you can swap **your** with **YOU ARE** when you are writing to be sure if it needs an apostrophe or not!

E.g.

Your cat (the cat belonging to you) has eaten my rabbit!

You're (You are) going to have to buy me a new rabbit.
