L.O: To understand how Christians use metaphors and art to explain God as three in one.

Some ideas: egg tree candle


Jot down your ideas - you may want them later for your activity.

Christians think God is mysterious and they don't expect to 'get' God completely, but they show their beliefs in their songs, paintings and stained glass windows.

The following slides show their beliefs that God is the Trinity, God is the Creator, Rescuer (Jesus the Saviour) and the Presence in all life today (the Holy Spirit).

God the Trinity


Father, Son and Holy Spirit

God the rescuer


Jesus the Saviour

The Holy Spirit







Look at these images of the Trinity. Which one do you think shows the Trinity the best?

I want you to think about the idea of God. Do you find it mysterious? I wonder what questions you might have - maybe write some down and discuss with someone in your household.

Here are some diagrams and symbols that try to explain the Trinity.






All three are the same, but different. Some Christians explain the Trinity like this. What do you think about this idea of God?

How would you explain the idea of God as three in one to a reception age child?









The apple can help explain the Trinity to an older child. It has 3 parts, the skin, flesh and seeds.

Christians would say the skin is like God the Father, because He protects us.

The flesh is like God the Son, because Jesus Christ took on human flesh.

The seeds are like God the Holy Spirit, because He helps us to grow. Each of the parts of an apple is different, but they are all 'apple.'



R.E challenges:
