L.O: To understand how Christians show their belief about the Trinity in worship

Aim: To learn how Christians use art and music to help express their ideas about the Holy Spirit.

Do you remember finding out about baptisms last week?

This is the ceremony that Christians believe welcomes an infant or older person into the family of God.

How did you get on? Check through your learning if you need to.

Baptism is 'once in a lifetime' but prayer is every day.

Do you remember learning about 'The Grace'? When Paul (who wrote one of the gospels) wrote a letter to the Corinthians, he included this blessing (known as 'The Grace').

This asks for God to be with the people who hear the prayer.

The Grace

May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all. Amen. 2 Corinthians 13:14

This blessing shows how for Christians, this sense of God being with them, all around and even within their lives is a part of believing in God the Holy Spirit.

This blessing is widely used in churches and in some Christian schools, often at the end of worship. The members of the group say it to each other, so it is not a prayer that is addressed to God but a blessing.

Christians sometimes try to express their belief in the Holy Spirit as a sense of God being all around and within their lives through art or music. Click on the link to hear this song by Stephen which expresses this idea. Once you have listened to it, could you try and sing it?

Do you agree that this song might help explain the idea of the Holy Spirit part of God being all around for Christians?

Perhaps you could try and write another verse or two?


