

New build moving plans!

We are very excited that after half term, the Y1 & Y2 children will be in the new building and the temporary classrooms will be fenced off in readiness to be converted back to the school field. The Co-op gate will re-open for parents to drop off and pick up.

There will be a pathway across to the Junior school from there, and it will also be linked back up to the reception classrooms, so all parents can use that entrance if they wish.

On the first day back, all Y1 & Y2 pupils should be dropped off at the Infant school hall and

they will then be shown around and taken to their new class by their teachers so that they are familiar with the lay out.

We will put up some temporary signs to direct you and staff will be at the gate to assist.

From Wednesday 5th November the Y1 classes will come in from the external doors facing the Co-op car park and the Y2 classes will go around the end of the building into the courtyard and go into their classrooms from there.

There will be an opportunity on Tuesday 4th November for Y1 parents and on Weds 5th for Y2 parents collecting at 3:20pm to come in to have a quick tour of the new buildings.

Breakfast club will be moved back into the newly refurbished Infants Hall.

Joe Wicks is coming back!

As we are sure the children have told you, Joe Wicks will be coming back to 'open' our new school on 12 November. We are thrilled to welcome him back!

Please note: this event is for the children only, unfortunately we will not be able to accommodate any parents/carers.

It is very likely filming will take place, which will be posted on social media. We will follow parents' wishes regarding this as per the current GDPR permissions you have given. If we do not have permission for filming or posting to social media then your child will still be fully involved, but in a section that is not being filmed – they will not miss out on anything!

Y5 SS Great Britain trip

On Thursday 9th October, year 5 went on a school trip to SS Great Britain in Bristol. The children were very excited as we were all on one coach which seated 100 people and thankfully, the coach journey was straightforward and we didn't hit any traffic, I am not sure I could have listened to many more renditions of the wheels of the bus if it had taken longer!

We were very lucky with the weather and had lovely sunshine all day which meant the

children were able to spend a decent amount of time looking around all the outside exhibits. We split into small groups but moved around as a class with different starting points so everyone could see the exhibits closely. The children were able to go aboard SS Great Britain and experience life on board this amazing ship. They learnt that the first-class passengers got a very different experience than the third-class passengers. The lower down in the ship your cabin was, the more cramped and smellier it became. There were a number of mannequins which on occasions made the children jump as they were very lifelike.



Children got the opportunity to steer the ship by turning the captain's wheel and also to scrub the deck as a deckhand.

The children got the opportunity to see underneath the ship and learn about what made this ship special (namely the hull was built of steel and it had a propeller). The children were amazed that they could see underneath the ship.

They learnt that in order to preserve the ship for future generations, the air has to be warm and dry. Some of the children observed that it was like being in a desert.

There was a museum dedicated to the life and work of Isambard Kingdom Brunel and the children were able to touch and explore objects in each of the rooms. The experience culminated in a video of life inside Brunel's mind. The children learnt about the impact that the Brunel's inventions had on Bristol and the UK in general. They got the opportunity to sit inside a train carriage that gave a rather bumpy ride. They also learnt that Clifton Suspension Bridge is one of Brunel's inventions. The final museum was the Dockyard Museum where children learnt about the type of people who would have been passengers onboard the SS Great Britain.



They also got the opportunity to dress up in Victorian style clothing and to try out a top hat just like the one Brunel was famous for wearing. The children behaved extremely well and moved around the area respectfully which was very pleasing. Hopefully they came home and told you all about their amazing trip and hopefully they learnt about the impact of Brunel's inventions on trade in Bristol.

Year 5 trip to Chew Valley Farm

A group of enthusiastic Year 5s spent the day at Chew Valley Community Farm, which is on the slopes of Chew Valley Lake, to find out how organic food grows and how wild life can thrive in this environment.



After harvesting a selection of herbs and vegetables, including chard, pumpkin, parsley and mint, we headed off to the wooden Round House to make, cook and eat fillo pastry parcels which contained our harvested food along with feta cheese. Our fillo parcels were delicious!



After a quick visit to the composting toilets, the day ended with a nature quiz in amongst edible flowers, raised herb beds and a pond. The children were great ambassadors for our school and everyone thoroughly enjoyed themselves.

Plane on the playground!



What? There's a plane in the playground? Yes, it WAS a plane! Some of you may have spotted a 2 seater aircraft on the junior playground today. This was no mistake! The aircraft belongs to Mission Aviation Fellowship (MAF) and it spent the whole day at school as part of a community weekend with Yatton Methodist Church.

The day started off with an assembly, led by a member of the MAF team, and was followed by class visits throughout the day to the plane where children had the opportunity to sit in the cockpit and learn more about MAF. Despite the changeable weather, it will be a day to remember for quite a long time and a great way to end the term.

There is another opportunity to see the plane up close as it will be on display at the Methodist Church carpark tomorrow (Saturday 25th Oct) between 10am and 3pm. Lunch will be available and the opportunity to use a flight simulator and to sit in the plane. Do go along!

Car Park Gates

In order to increase security and the safety of our pupils, the staff car park gates will be automated after half term (we do not yet have an exact date for this). The vehicle gate will be open from 6.30am until 8.30am to allow drop off to breakfast club.

The pedestrian gate will remain open for parents to drop off until all gates are closed shortly after 9am.

Once the gates are closed, visitors will need to use an intercom which will be linked to the school office. The midwife centre will also have an intercom with a separate call button.

The pedestrian gate will be re-opened from 3.10pm but the vehicle gate will not re-open until 4pm for after school club pick-ups.

Permit holders and blue badge holders will need to use the intercom and will be permitted entry by the school office. We would ask that anyone without a permit or blue badge no longer uses the car park to drop off and pick up, thank you.

Can you help girls in Yatton develop new skills, build their confidence and have adventures?






