Learning a musical instrument in school

If your child is interested in learning a musical instrument in school, at Yatton Schools, they can do so from Year 2 through to Year 6.

Instrumental music lessons in school are provided by peripatetic teachers from WEMA (West of England Music and Arts). Please see the attached flyer for the link for more information and to sign up for lessons. At Yatton, you will need to REGISTER DIRECTLY with WEMA. WEMA will then let Yatton Schools know there is a new student and will make arrangements to teach the student in school time.

Children can learn the instruments below in the following year groups at Yatton:

Year 2 - children can learn the recorder or violin (with Mrs Francis Black)

Year 3/4/5/6 - children can choose any instrument from the list provided in the link (the list includes - clarinet, recorder, oboe, flute, acoustic guitar, saxophone, trombone, trumpet, tuba, ukelele, violin) and WEMA will provide a music teacher for that instrument for your child

Egyptian Wow Day – Y3

Last term, in History, year 3 learnt all about the Ancient Egyptians. We ended our learning with an Egyptian wow day where we dressed up as Ancient Egyptians and took part in different activities.

First, we made scarab beetle amulets using clay. The Ancient Egyptians believed that scarab beetles would protect them on their journey into the afterlife. They had Scarab beetle amulets as a symbol of protection and as representation of the Sun God Ra.



Next, we mummified tomatoes. During our reading lessons that week we read instructions on how to mummify a tomato, using a similar process that embalmers would have used in Ancient Egyptian times to mummify the bodies of important people. First, we needed to scoop out the seeds (Organs) then clean the whole tomato with hand sanitiser to get rid of all bacteria so that the tomato does not rot. Then

we dried the tomato and rubbed salt and bicarbonate of soda all over it. We have put them in airtight tubs so that we can keep checking on the mummification process.



After that we learnt about Hieroglyphics and wrote our names on papyrus paper, which is what the Ancient Egyptians would have used. We also made our own paper pyramids.





Finally, we designed our own Pharaoh head piece using Geometric shapes and coloured them in using pastel crayons. We took a photo of our side profiles and put our designs on our photos to make us look like Ancient Egyptian Pharaohs.

At the end of the day we shocked our parents at home time by wearing our Egyptian death masks we had made in DT that term. We had such a fun day and have learnt so much about the Ancient Egyptians. Ask your child about the process of mummifying the dead and their journey into the afterlife. They thoroughly enjoyed learning about this

Quad Kids

Last Friday, 20 of our Year 6 pupils—10 boys and 10 girls—represented the school superbly at the North Somerset Quadkids competition.

Competing against other local schools, the children took part in four challenging events: the standing long jump, vortex throw, 75m sprint, and 600m endurance run.

The team demonstrated fantastic spirit throughout the day, showing great collaboration, determination, and resilience in every event as they pushed themselves to achieve their best. Their hard work certainly paid off, with our A team securing **1st place** and our B team taking an impressive **2nd place** overall.

Thanks to these outstanding results, both teams have now qualified to compete against schools

from across the wider Bristol area this coming Monday—an exciting next step!

A special mention goes to **Sam C** and **Jack C**, who achieved the highest individual scores of the day—an incredible accomplishment. Well done to the whole team—we are very proud of you all!

Extended School Club fees

We are pleased to confirm that following a review of our current fee structure, we will not be increasing Breakfast Club or YAS fees for the forthcoming academic year.

Lettings

The schools' halls, outside areas and some other spaces are available to let on evenings and weekends for community and voluntary groups. The Trust positively welcomes the contribution that well run groups which organise community-based activities are able to make and which provide a vital link with the community.

The Trust's policy is for charges for the use of school facilities to cover the costs of hire and, where appropriate, raise additional funds for the school, so this is a vital source of extra income for the schools when budgets are being stretched as they are now.

Following a review of the lettings fees it has been agreed that these will increase from 1 September 2026 due to the significant increases in utility costs (they have remained the same since January 2023). These are in line with the charges of other local venues with similar facilities and can be found at Appendix 4 of the Policy.

GUIDANCE FOR PARENTS AND CARERS



From September 2026, more families will be eligible for Free School Meals



Applying could save you up to £495 per child, per year, on school lunches

FREE SCHOOL MEAL EXPANSION

More families may be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) from September 2026, when families receiving Universal Credit will be able to access free school meals.

There will be two types of Free School Meal eligibility from September 2026:



TARGETED FSM

Continues to be based on the existing £7,400 income threshold.



EXPANDED FSM (NEW)

Applies to meals only. Covers pupils whose households are in receipt of Universal Credit



IMPORTANT: While eligibility to Expanded FSM will be automatically granted to all recipients of Universal Credit, families will still need to apply to receive this benefit.

RECHECKS FOR ALL PUPILS CURRENTLY IN RECEIPT OF FSM

Since 2018, there has been a Free School Meal transitional protection policy to ensure that children didn't lose their free school meals if their family's income increased. This meant that free school meals entitlement has been typically locked in until the end of the child's current phase of education (e.g. end of primary or secondary school).

This protection is ending at the end of the 2025-26 academic year.

This means that all existing pupils in receipt of free school meals will need to have their entitlement rechecked before the start of September 2026. If your family's earnings exceed the FSM threshold, your child(ren) will lose their eligibility and pay for school meals from September 2026.



In most cases, these rechecks will be automatic and no action will be required by parents



NORTH SOMERSET SCHOOLS ONLY

Anyone who was awarded FSMs over 2 years ago would have applied via an old system. These parents/carers will need to reapply via their North Somerset Citizen's account.



ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR SCHOOLS THAT BENEFITS PUPILS

Pupil Premium is extra funding given to schools for every child whose family is entitled for Targeted Free School Meals. This money makes a big difference to schools and the eligible pupils. It is often used for extra resources, school trips and additional staff. Pupil Premium will continue to be paid to schools for those pupils who have been covered by the transitional protection arrangements outlined above.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS HOW TO APPLY

1 CHECK IF YOU COULD BE ELIGIBLE

From September 2026, more families may be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM):

- **TARGETED FSM** - based on low household income (see benefits listed below)
- **EXPANDED FSM** - if you receive Universal Credit, you may be eligible



MY CHILD IS IN RECEPTION OR KS1 - DO I STILL NEED TO APPLY?

Yes, children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 receive Universal Infant Free School Meals automatically. However, registering for Free School Meals may provide access to additional funding and support for the school and your child.



YOU COULD BE ELIGIBLE FOR FSM IF:

1. Your household receives Universal Credit

OR

2. You receive any of the following benefits:

- income support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration & Asylum Act*
- Child Tax Credit*
- Working Tax Credit*

As Children's Commissioner, I'm writing to ask for your support in helping children at your school or college take part in my national survey, The Big Future.

As schools and colleges return for the final weeks of the academic year, this is a valuable opportunity for children and young people to reflect on their experiences, share what matters most to them, and tell us about their hopes and ambitions for the future in their own words.

Direct student participation is essential to ensuring that young people's voices are heard and represented. To encourage engagement, I am inviting schools and colleges to identify student champions who can help promote the survey among their peers. Student champions who generate particularly high levels of participation will receive a formal thank you from my office, recognising their contribution to amplifying young people's voices. This is also an excellent example of leadership and participation that students may wish to reference in future personal statements, CVs and applications.

I want to hear from children and young people aged 0-18 from every background, in every part of the country. The survey asks about the things they enjoy, the challenges they face, the changes they would like to see in their communities, and what they believe a good childhood should look like today.

Participation in The Big Future also provides schools with an opportunity to demonstrate their commitment to civic engagement. The findings will help inform national conversations and decision-making about children's lives and futures at the highest levels. Schools and colleges with the highest response levels will receive formal recognition and will be invited to attend my final Festival of Childhood, celebrating the voices and contributions of children and young people from across England.

To support you, I have created a pack of resources, including an introductory video, lesson materials and FAQs, all available on [my website](#).

I will publish the findings next year, and they will help shape the conversations and decisions being made about children's lives and futures for years to come. As ever, thank you so much for your support.
