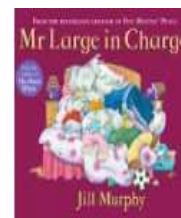

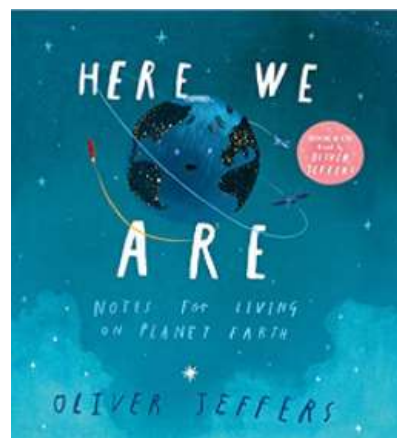


**Dotty has the most beautiful feathers. Stalky has the most beautiful legs. And Plumy has the most beautiful crest. But which of them is the most beautiful?**
